Readers are reminded that you do not have to be confirmed in order to attend a Holy Communion service. These services always include all the usual hymns and prayers and a talk from whoever is leading the service which will all be appropriate to the time of year or to particular festivals or national events.

Carol-singing and Christmas Draw

There was once again a very good turn-out of volunteer carol singers this year and their efforts and the generosity of their 'customers' earned £896 for our church funds during four evenings of touring around all areas of the village, from Ferry Lane to White City. They also sang to the residents in The Old Vicarage for half an hour on the Saturday afternoon before Christmas and everyone there enjoyed the experience very much indeed.

All 600 books of Christmas Draw tickets were sold at £2 per book. From this income of £1200, we had to deduct £56 for the printing of the tickets, £20 for our lottery licence and £100 which the PCC contributed from its own funds to provide four cash prizes of £25. All the other 41 prizes were kindly donated by individuals or local organisations and all the prizes were claimed. The church funds will therefore have benefitted by £1.024 from this initiative and everyone who bought and sold the books of tickets or who donated a prize is warmly thanked by the PCC.
