

HAVE YOURSELF A MERRY LITTLE CHRISTMAS



CHRISTMAS CANAPÉS

Santapés



Ingredients 1 punnet ripe plum tomatoes 1 mozzarella ball 1 bunch fresh basil leaves 4-5 slices prosciutto or smoked salmon, torn into small pieces 2 tablespoons balsamic glaze Cocktail sticks to serve

Steps



1. Using a sharp knife, slice only the very top part of the tomatoes off, just so that they have a more stable surface to sit on. Here's a tip - only cut off the *very* thinnest slice you can, to avoid cutting into the fleshy seeded part. Otherwise the juice can run out and look messy on the platter.

Prep

15 mins

Slice the tomato in two even halves. The top you've sliced will be the base. The pointed bottom is the 'hat' to go on top.

2.Slice a ball of cheese into even slices, and place a slice on the tomato base. Top with a piece of folded prosciutto, a basil leaf, and season with salt (and pepper if you like). Gently place the top on, holding it all steady as you insert the cocktail stick to hold everything in place.

3.Squirt a small blob of balsamic glaze on to a platter. Gently place the Santa on top.

4.Repeat until all the ingredients are used up. Best served straight away but you can keep them in the fridge for an hour or so on a plate, and put them on the platter with the balsamic just before you serve.

Rice krispie Christmas



Time 1hr Makes 1hr 18 18 *Ingredients* 200g Milk Chocolate 50g Unsalted Butter 180g Mini Marshmallows 100g Rice Krispies 50g White Chocolate Green & Red fondant

Steps

1.Add chocolate & butter into a saucepan, gently melt over a low to med heat. Add marshmallows & gently stir until they've melted & combined.

2.In a large mixing bowl, add the Rice Krispies. Pour over the chocolate mixture & stir together until fully coated.

3.Using a tbsp divide the mixture into equal amounts, roll each into a pudding ball.

4.Put the puddings in the fridge to cool for 30mins.

5.Melt the white chocolate in a heatproof bowl, place over a saucepan of simmering water. Heat until all the chocolate has melted.

6.Place in a piping bag or freezer bag, and set aside to cool.

7.Use the green fondant for holly leaves, and roll the red into small balls for the berries.

8.Drizzle the white chocolate over the top. Decorate with the holly leaves and berries.

Turkey, stuffing & cranberry puffs



Ingredient

S 350g turkey mince 200g sage & onion stuffing 3tbsp chopped dried cranberries 1tbsp English mustard 1½ tbsp. cranberry sauce 1 egg, beaten 1 tbsp black **1.**Put the turkey mince, stuffing, dried cranberries & some seasoning into a bowl and mix well.

2.Heat the oven to 200c/fan 180c. Roll the block of pastry to a 50x30cm rectangle and cut into 15 10 x 10cm squares. Brush a little mustard into one of the middle of one square and put 1tsp of cranberry sauce. Fold the four corners into the middle, making a loose parcel and seal slightly at the top. Transfer to a baking – paper lined tray, brush witth beaten egg and sprinkle with onion seeds. Repeat with the remaining dough and filling.


3.Bake for 15-20 mins until puffed & golden.

CHURCH CORNER

Church services in December:

At the moment, there are no firmly fixed services for December in Airmyn church but there may well soon be some arranged for the Christmas period. *It all depends upon what the Government says we are allowed to do in our area of the country after the current national lockdown comes to an end*.

Space in the church will be extremely limited if and when any services do take place because several pews remain closed off in order to ensure that social distancing of a minimum of two metres is maintained. We will inform everyone via social media and the noticeboard in front of the lychgate if and when services are to resume.

Private prayer:

In the meantime, the church will be open on Sunday mornings between 10-30 and 11-30 for anyone wishing to enter for the purpose of private prayer.

Recorded services:

Our Vicar, the Rev. Philip Ball, is continuing to record and broadcast services from all three churches in our Benefice, Airmyn, Hook and Rawcliffe, each in their turn, and these can be viewed on You Tube via the St. James Rawcliffe live feed, which can be found in your search engine. They really are very, very good.

Cancelled events:

We are very sorry to have to report that there will be no Airmyn Church Christmas Draw this year. It was felt that it would have been extremely inadvisable and unwelcome (and it might well have been illegal) for PCC members to have come round knocking at people's doors seeking to sell Draw tickets during the current Covid-19 pandemic. It is a great shame because this has been a very dependable and very well-supported annual fund-raiser for our village church for more than 35 years. It is not just about the money, however. It is the fact that this event always involves just about every household in our community. Nobody enters with much hope of winning a prize. They do so just to be involved and to give a bit towards the upkeep of the church. The carol-singing tour of the village by choir members + friends is also cancelled this year. This tradition goes back without a break even further than the Christmas Draw, having been started in the late nineteen fifties by the likes of Tom Middlebrook, George Barker, Stan Airey, Margaret Goulden, Emily Hunt and Margaret Tordoff. We wonder how many of our current readers can remember all those good people. Once again, this is an event which embraces the entire village and such events are all too rare in this day and age. A very limited number of PCC members are intending to play recorded Christmas music around the village streets and they will have a collection box with them so you may make a contribution to church funds by this means if you so wish.

All members of St. David's PCC wish all readers as happy and as safe a Christmas as you can possibly manage in the current circumstances and we pray for a much happier and more normal New Year.
