Pork, chilli & bean stew

Serves 4 Ready in 30 minutes

1 tbsp olive oil
400g diced pork
200g chorizo
1 red onion, sliced
2 cloves of garlic
Large pinch of chilli flakes
1 tsp ground cumin
1 red pepper, cut into chunks
400g tin chopped tomatoes
400ml chicken stock
250g small salad potatoes, halved
100g green beans
Handful of fresh coriander, chopped

Some of us may no longer work in lbs and oz but together as a community I would love to gather some of our new favourite recipes and make a 21st century collection that the 'Airmyn First School Mums' would be proud of. Let's start with one of my favourite crowd pleasers...

1 Fry the pork

Heat the olive oil in a large non-stick pan. Season the pork then quickly brown all over. Add the chorizo then scoop out the meat and put on a plate. Add the onion and garlic to the pan and cook for 1 minute. Add the chilli flakes, cumin and pepper and cook for 2 minutes.

2 Return the pork and chorizo to the pan with the tinned tomatoes and chicken stock. Bring to a simmer and add the potatoes. Cook for another 5 minutes. Season & scatter over the coriander to finish.

Did you know?

The following is from 'Airmyn in days gone by' Volume 3 by David Galloway.

In 1919 when the Airmyn Estate was sold by the Heber – Percies, nobody stood to gain anything by buying the village clock or its site. The family didn't want the clock either but initially at least it wasn't prepared to bequeath it to the village, even though it had been paid for by public subscription. (The tower had cost £700, the clock £130 and it was said the builders made a profit of just 7s 6d). The Parish Council refused on principle to pay even a nominal annual rent so the tower was locked and the clock stopped for almost four years. Eventually, in February, 1924, a "Goole Times" reporter mirrored the farcial stalemate in appropriate verse:

1. Dickery, Dickery Dock
They want a rent for the clock
But the Council say
They will not pay,
Decidedly, certainly not
2. Dickery Dickery Dock,
They've turned the key in the lock
Silent it stands
With folded hands,
The poor old Airmyn clock.
3. Dickery, Dickery Dock,
The Earl of Beverley clock,
'Tis only willing
To go for a shilling,
Dickery, Dickery Dock.

Airmyn Parish Council minutes from the meeting on Wednesday 13 November 2019 at 7pm.

Opening the meeting: Cllr Fox opened the meeting at 7pm and welcomed everyone.

Present: Cllrs Caroline Fox, Christine Healey, Sylvia Scott, Matt Lynch, Sue Hayward; Clerk, Rob Charlesworth.

Apologies: Cllrs Phil Batten, Andy Jackson

Vacancies: Two vacancies exist.

Minutes approval: Minutes from the October meeting were approved.

Public participation: Flooding - can APC contribute to the flooding incident in Fishlake? To discuss in Ward Councillors report.

Ongoing issues

Bowls Club hedge: 3 quotes obtained and previously circulated. **Resolved** to accept quote from G Fillingham (Proposed: Cllr Fox; Seconded: Cllr Scott). **Action:** Clerk to notify contractors.

Field drains: Responses received from Drainage Board & Environment Agency. **Resolved** to invite IDB to the January meeting for further discussion and potentially hold the meeting at Goole Fire Station. **Action:** Clerk to follow up.

Community Speed Watch: **Resolved** to accept CSW volunteers as a working party under APC.

Grass contracts: Both draft contracts reviewed prior to the meeting and **resolved** that once updated, to include the annual maintenance of the bowls club hedge, they are approved for issue.

Play area inspection: The annual play area inspection had been conducted, some issues to follow up on. **Action:** Cllr Jackson to be asked by the Clerk to follow up.

Planning reports 19/03491/TPO – for note, already reviewed and no objections from APC.

New correspondence: ERYC updated Code of Conduct received and circulated previously, **resolved** to adopt the updated code.

Issues raised by councillors: Village CCTV – some concerns in the village over recent break ins and comments made about APC installing CCTV. This issue had been investigated previously and a decision made that it was too expensive. **Resolved** that no further action is required.

Clerk report: **Hall field boundary:** Notification received that Northern Power Grid will be carrying out pruning work next year on some of the boundary trees to ensure a safe distance is maintained from electrical cables.

Upcoming meetings: **ERNLLCA Clerk Induction:** Clerk attending training on 19/11.

Ward Councillors report: The seat on the Crossings has now been installed. The recent flooding in Fishlake and surrounding areas has been discussed. All parish & town councils in the ward are to consider making a donation, subject to confirmation that this is allowed, and Snaith would co-ordinate donations. **Resolved** to donate £250, subject to receiving confirmed approval of process (Proposed: Cllr Healey; Seconded: Cllr Lynch).

Financial matters: Bank reconciliation: Account statement provide for review and all transactions approved. (Spending: G Fillingham – grass contract 1 £3,535.99; Team Sport & Play – play area £354.00)

Meeting close: The Chair thanked everyone for their attendance and closed the meeting at 7.40pm.
