GEM SHARE SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT GROUP

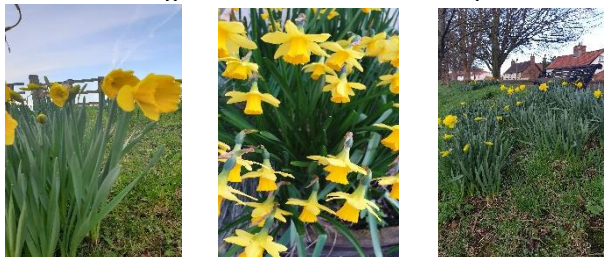

Daffodils are the first brave flowers of spring. Their yellow buds break through the packed down dirt of winter as if they were the Earth's internal sunshine trying to bring colour back into our lives. These harbingers of spring were beloved by the Romans until they were lost to the sands of time. It was only in the early 17th century when they were rediscovered in the weeds by an Englishman. Daffodils are also known as Narcissus. This mythical word derives from classical Greek mythology where a beautiful youth became so entranced with his own reflection that he pined away for himself. As a punishment for his vanity, the gods turned him into this flower. Additionally, some call these flowers the Lent Lily due to the long association with the fasting period of Christianity. Recipe of the month

1 onion finely chopped

2 tbsp olive oil

350g risotto rice

1 garlic clove finely chopped

1 1/2 l of boiling vegetable stock

170g smoked salmon

85g mascarpone

3 tbsp flat leaf parsley

Grated lemon zest plus squeeze of juice

Handful of rocket

1. Fry the onion for 5 mins. Add the rice and garlic, then cook for 2 mins, stirring continuously. Pour in a third of the stock and set the timer for 20 mins. Simmer, stirring occasionally, until the stock has been absorbed, then add half the rest of stock and carry on cooking, stirring a bit more frequently, until that has been absorbed.

2. Pour the last of the stock, stir then simmer until cooked and creamy. Take from the heat and add mascarpone, parsley and lemon zest. Grind in some black pepper but don't add salt as the salmon will be salty enough. Serve topped with chopped smoked salmon, rocket and a little lemon juice if you like.

Airmyn Parish Council minutes from the meeting on Wednesday 8th January 2020 at 7pm.

Guest: Alison Briggs from Goole & Airmyn IDB. Alison gave a presentation on the Drainage Boards, the geology of the area and the work of the IDB. Many areas in Airmyn are at low level, only the strategic watercourses are maintained by the IDB and water pumped from them into the local rivers, all are in excellent condition. Alison commented that a common misconception is that greenery within a watercourse is detrimental to the operation of the watercourse - this is not true.

Opening the meeting: Cllr Fox opened the meeting at 7.55pm and welcomed everyone.

Present: Cllrs Caroline Fox, Christine Healey, Sylvia Scott, Sue Hayward, Andy Jackson; Clerk, Rob Charlesworth. 0 members of the public.

Apologies: Cllr Matt Lynch

Public participation: 1 issue raised via Cllr Hayward – some vegetation encroaching on the Crossings footpath.

Ongoing issues

Field drains: Discussed above, thanks to be sent to Alison for her attendance.

Grass contracts: Quotes discussed and contractor selected. Minor amendment approved for contract 2. **Action:** Clerk to notify all contractors.

Play area inspection: Cllr Jackson fed back on the annual play area inspection report. Work on the slides will be completed soon, only other issues were minor and will be discussed further at a future meeting. Tesco funding appeal now active in the Goole store (tokens).

Bracken Hill: Friends Group access agreement discussed, some concerns over historic use of site, insurance cover and uncontrolled access. **Action:** Clerk to check with Friends Group.

Upcoming meetings: ERNLLCA 'Being a Good employer' training: Cllr Scott possibly attending.

Ward Councillors report: Approval for donations to the Fishlake Appeal was not received, therefore APC unable to contribute. Residents can help with fundraising by supporting St David's Church breakfast event at Airmyn Memorial Hall on 2nd Feb, the hall is being provided free of charge.

Financial matters: Bank reconciliation: Account statement provide for review and all transactions approved.
(Spending: R Westmoreland - grass contract 2 £3,804; ERYC - street lights £928.98)
Precept 2020-21: has not been increased over recent years but costs have increased, **resolved** to set at £25,000.
VAT reclaim: **resolved** to discuss increased VAT costs in this financial year with HMRC. **Action:** Clerk to contact HMRC.

Meeting close: The Chair thanked everyone for their attendance and closed the meeting at 9pm.

Services at St. David's during March



Sunday, 1st - **St. David's Day!** Holy Communion 4pm

Sunday, 29th Holy Communion (shortened service)
4pm: followed by the Annual Vestry Meeting, at which the two churchwardens for Airmyn will be elected, or re-elected, as the case may be. Please note that this meeting does not actually take place in the vestry but in the main body of the church! This meeting will then be followed by the Annual General Meeting of the Parochial Church Council. Reports on different aspects of the life of our church during the past year will be read in turn by our Vicar, the PCC Secretary and one of the churchwardens. The PCC Treasurer will make available copies of the audited bank accounts for our church and will summarise their content.

Volunteers required:

Readers should note that there are always jobs to be done by volunteers both inside the church and outside in the churchyard here in Airmyn. Some of these roles are contained within our weekly services, taking a turn at doing a reading, acting as a sides person by giving out the hymn books and the prayer books and by taking the collection, or by singing in the choir. Others involve practical help with jobs both inside and outside; mowing a section of the churchyard, cleaning the church gutters or trimming the boundary hedges, for example, or joining the cleaning rota to keep the inside of the church looking smart, taking a turn to polish the church brasses or perhaps helping to redecorate the interior of the church. Most, but not all, of this work is done on a regular but not over-demanding basis and newcomers to our existing small team of helpers would be made most welcome.
