Message from the Vice-Chair of Airmyn Parish Council

As the long, hot summer draws to a close we are very pleased to confirm that the drainage works on the Airmyn Playing Field are nearing completion. The pipework is in place and drainage channels backfilled, with just topsoil and levelling works remaining. We are hopeful that this grant-funded work will secure a sustainable future for the field and enable even more community groups to make use of the amazing facilities our village has to offer.

On the subject of amazing facilities, the Bee Keeping tenant has now vacated the former-Bowls Club site and APC are working closely with Screetons to identify a suitable new tenant from the applicants that have approached us so far.

On behalf of the council and our community, I also want to take this opportunity to extend our sincere thanks to Tony Butcher for the incredible work he has done during his short time as Caretaker. Sadly, Tony decided to resign from the post in August, but the impact of his efforts will continue to be felt for much longer as our residents enjoy the benefits of renovated benches, cleared dykes, weatherproof buildings and secure gates to name but a few.

Our regular, monthly, Parish Council Meetings took place in the Memorial Hall in June and July, attended by ERYC Ward Councillor, Liz Sargeantson and members of the public. Residents are reminded that public participation is always welcome, and I encourage anyone with an interest in our community to come along to the next meeting. You may have noticed that the works on the playing field meant that we did not hold a summer event this year, but we hope everyone will participate in the 3rd Annual Airmyn Scarecrow Festival on 20th September and the Christmas Fayre on 30th November.

And now that I have introduced the dreaded "C" word I also wanted to draw everyone's attention to the fact that the New Year 2026 sees the 350th Anniversary of St David's Church nave and APC along with the Airmyn Community Association will be supporting the church to ensure this anniversary is celebrated in style.

Sadly, the Parish Clerk continues to be absent from work and our Interim Clerk, Vonny has been doing a fantastic job of keeping everything running smoothly. However, this unprecedented situation does continue to impact significantly upon our finances. All Parish Councillors are volunteers and we work hard to ensure value for money and financial probity at all times. Next to staff costs, one of our largest expenses is vegetation management and I am sure you will agree that our contractor, James Duffin does great work cutting the riverbank and public areas under APCs control, ably supported by the Community Payback Team, who also assist the church in keeping the graveyard tidy.

Ongoing repairs within the church:

Substantial repairs are currently being carried out to the internal east wall of the chancel and to the internal stonework surrounding the east window. That is why there is scaffolding erected there at the present time and also why the organ has been screened off to protect it from dust. During the initial stages of these repairs, after the very thick and defective render/plaster had been totally removed from the east wall, it was discovered that four roof purlins were decaying at the points where they are inserted into the east gable and will require remedial work to restore them to full strength. It was also found that more of the newly-exposed stonework around the east window was in a very poor condition owing to the shoddy workmanship of a previous repair carried out a long time ago. The extra work now required will almost double the original anticipated cost so an application for a grant to meet these extra costs has been submitted to the Rusholme Wind Farm Fund and we are awaiting the outcome of this application.

Sincere thanks are extended to Anthony and Wendy Walton for their kindness in playing host once again to a very successful Tea and Cakes fund-raising event for the church.

Please note that they will be also playing host to a fund-raising event for the **Macmillan Cancer Support organisation** throughout the day on **Friday, the 26th September** and we hope that you will support this.

Craft Fair:

There will be a Craft Fair inside our church on Saturday, the 20th September from 10-00 am until 3-00 pm. This will be of a very similar nature to the one which was held very successfully at this time last year. It coincides with the village's Scarecrow Festival so whilst you are having a walk around the village, do make sure that you have a look inside the church.

Goole's 200th anniversary:

You are reminded that 2026 will mark the 200th anniversary of the establishment of the Port of Goole as the sea-going terminus of the Aire and Calder Navigation's network of inland waterways. **Goole Civic Society is organising a series of events to celebrate this anniversary and it has adopted a calendar prepared by Mr. Harold Mason of Rawcliffe as its 'official' one to mark the occasion.** The calendar is comprised of twelve paintings done by Harold, one for each month of 2026, which show different historical views of Goole as it was at various stages in its earlier development. These calendars are now available to buy from Goole Library or, if they have sold out, you may contact Harold himself by telephoning 01405 839521 and order one directly from him. They cost £8 each and the proceeds are being shared by the Goole Civic Society and a Christian charity called Share Africa.

Innovation and engineering also took centre stage this term, thanks to a collaborative project with Siemens. Pupils had the opportunity to design and build model trains, applying STEM skills in a hands-on and creative way. The culmination of this project was a celebration event held at Snaith School, where the children raced their creations and shared their learning with engineers from Siemens. The event was a testament to the power of industry partnerships in inspiring the next generation of engineers and problem-solvers.



In a burst of colour and community spirit, the school hosted a successful Colour Run, which saw pupils, staff, and families come together for a fun-filled fundraising event. The proceeds from the run have been used to purchase new tablets, which will enhance the delivery of the computing curriculum and support digital literacy across all year groups.

Airmyn Park's commitment to safety and civic responsibility was also evident through a creative initiative led by the local Police Community Support Officer (PCSO). A poster competition aimed at promoting safer parking around the school saw enthusiastic participation from pupils. The winning entry earned its creator a special visit to the local police station, where they learned about the role of the police in keeping communities safe. The winning poster will soon be proudly displayed at the front of the school, serving as a colourful and important reminder to parents and visitors.



Sporting success was another reason for celebration, as the Year 3 and 4 football team triumphed at the county level. The tournament was fiercely competitive, but the team's determination, skill, and camaraderie led them to victory. Their achievement has brought pride to the school and inspired younger pupils to get involved in sports.

The term ended on a high note with a whole-school celebration recognising pupils who consistently demonstrated the school's values. Awards were given to children across all year groups, with special recognition for the youngest winners who have already begun to embody the spirit of Airmyn Park. The event was a joyful reflection of the school's nurturing environment and its dedication to character development.

Even after the school gates closed for the summer, the learning and fun continued. Airmyn Park's holiday club ran successfully once again, offering a wide range of activities to keep children engaged and active. One of the standout moments was a trip to the MKM Stadium in Hull, where children explored the changing rooms, pitch, and dugout, gaining a behind-the-scenes look at a professional sports venue.
