Vehicles exceeding the weight restriction limit travelling along the High Street

Villagers have been deeply concerned about the number of farm vehicles using the High Street in order to by-pass Goole; some are using the road to access fields on the western edge of the village. Registration numbers have been recorded and complaints made to the Local Neighbourhood Policing Team, headed by Sergeant Jackson.

I visited the Howden Police Station and handed in documents and photographs to express the depth of feeling within the community. I was informed that the movements of agricultural vehicles are not covered by the Road Traffic Act and so the Police are unable to stop these passing through the village. However, they have said that if any vehicle is seen committing an offence, they will take action. Speaking to the Humberside Police Command Centre, the officer told me there was no point in reporting these vehicles because the Neighbourhood Policing Team is well aware of our concerns. This information is contrary to what the Road Traffic Officers have said when asked.

The Police have also said that it is the responsibility of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to put in place traffic calming measures. Sadly, when approached, the council usually respond by saying there is not enough money to build physical barriers i.e. chicanes at both entrances to the village, and that there are more pressing cases where funds are to be directed. Many past members of Airmyn Parish Council have tried without success to make the case for a weight reduction on the weight limit in force on our road.

N.B. The editor has also written, as a parishioner, to our local MP, Andrew Percy, who raised the matter with Nigel Leighton, Director of Environment & Neighbourhood Services (ERYC), and Patrick McLoughlin, the Transport Secretary at the Department for Transport. Andrew forwarded the replies to me and, basically, they say that the combined size of tractors towing agricultural trailers has recently been increased to 31t, (trailer weight limit stays at 18.29t) and they are allowed to travel at a max of 25mph. Oversized agricultural vehicles are permitted within our 7.5t village limit but tellingly, from Mr Leighton, he says they are allowed if they are "loading or unloading within that limit", (A614 Glews junction to the south of Ferry Lane). Mr Leighton ends his letter by saying that he understands that "no-one has been caught violating this limit". We must hope that the police are able to be more vigilant in the future and check more thoroughly for any breaking of these conditions!

Ten Days of Prayer

The Vicar and the Airmyn Parochial Church Council members agreed at their recent monthly meeting that they would participate this year in a Sheffield Diocesan initiative called 'Ten Days of Prayer' and that this should be made known to everyone in the village via 'The Airmyn News' so that any individuals or small groups wishing to do so could be enabled to take part.

St. David's Church will therefore be open between 10-00 am and 4-00 pm on each of the 10 days from Ascension Day (**Thursday, the 14**th **May**) until and including Whit Sunday, (**Pentecost, the 24**th **May**). 'Prayer stations' will be set up in different parts of the church, each one being provided with materials intended to stimulate reflection upon one particular subject for prayer, such as, for example, world conflicts, or family concerns. People of all ages, including children, are encouraged to compose and write down their own prayers for use on this occasion and to come into church and sit down for a period of quiet reflection at any time during these 10 days.

Coach-house project news

The Coach-House Committee has just learned that its application to renovate the coach-house on the left-hand side of the entrance to the churchyard and to convert it into a multi-purpose community facility has been approved by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Planning Department. This means that the Committee, which actually came into being as long ago as January, 2012, can at long last seek to enter into a lease agreement for the building with the joint owners, the Airmyn PCC and the Sheffield Diocesan Board of Finance. The Committee is also applying to the Charity Commission for registration as a Charitably Incorporated Organisation. Thereafter, the Committee's architect will draw up detailed plans of the work that will be required to render the building fit for purpose (including a small toilet extension at the rear) and tenders will be obtained from at least three different builders. Grant aid will be sought to cover the bulk of the cost of the renovation work. There is still, therefore, quite a lot of work to be done but at least the Committee has now been given the go-ahead to get on with the job.

The Committee's latest Bonus Ball 'fund-raiser' started on Saturday, the 4th April, and the first winner was Mrs. Joan Sullivan with number 43. The competition runs for 4 more Saturdays.
