Recycling Bins update

We, (East Riding of Yorkshire Council), are currently having an issue with cardboard in the brown bins. Cardboard used to go in the brown bins, but as of June of last year, the whole of the east riding has been asked to put cardboard in the blue bin.

Elite Furniture Application

Almost 30 villagers who are still angry/perplexed/incredulous at the events of the past few months, met at the Memorial Hall for a hastily-convened meeting to discuss what could and should be done, given that we are now faced with a factory about to be built on our doorstep and an apparent impasse as regards halting the Elite application. Apologies to anyone who would have liked to attend and did not know about the meeting, but time was (and still is) of the essence.

Opinions fell into three camps: some felt we had to accept the fait accompli and do our best to hold the developers to within a hair's breadth of the planning stipulations; others wished to continue our campaign of resistance by continuing to speak out loudly about the way the planning process was conducted, in order to name and shame and prevent a recurrence; and then there were those who believe we should not lie down and roll over, rather we should seek a judicial review.

The consensus was that, whilst we do not wish to give up the fight, as a small village we do not have the financial means to pursue a judicial review, given that, should we lose, the costs were uncertain and might be astronomical. This is patently unfair and we are looking at whether we can restrict the costs, or find some benefactor. The Parish Council would not be in a position to fund any action, firstly because of the costs and secondly as no mandate for action has been sought from villagers.

In the meantime the following actions were decided:

- parishioners will be kept informed via the blog and Airmyn News;
- intervention by the Local Government Ombudsman and Planning Ombudsman will be investigated;
- the CPRE (*Campaign to Protect Rural England*) will be advised of the situation;
- legal advice will be sought as to the costs involved in both winning AND losing any judicial review;
- documentation regarding the exact funding of the roundabout will be requested;
- media contacts will be pursued, as well as contacts with Friends of the Earth, for further advice.

It was noted that the Parish Council would be remorseless in ensuring that every minute obligation laid down for the application would be adhered to; the gathering agreed that as villagers we would all have to be vigilant. This will be especially important given the non-compliance already evident at Court House Farm, where various landscaping requirements have been studiously ignored.

Beyond these issues, attendees agreed that the objective is now to protect the village from further incursions and to stop any other applications in their tracks. This is an issue which affects us ALL within the village and is not a case of NIMBYism – whatever your views on the factory's construction, it has major implications for us. Church News

Open Gardens Day - There has been a promising response so far to the proposal made by the Airmyn Parochial Church Council to hold an Open Gardens Day on **Sunday, the 14th June**, from about 10-30 am until 4-00 pm, with any proceeds from the occasion being donated to St. David's church funds. It looks, therefore, at the moment, very much as if the event will go ahead but there is still time and space for a couple more householders within the village to volunteer to have their gardens included as a part of the 'tour' that is being built up around the village. Coach-house project news - After all manner of unexpected, undeserved and very frustrating hold-ups, the planning application for the renovation of the coach-house at the top of the churchyard for use as a community facility was finally submitted to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council on the 6th January this year and is currently under consideration by their Planning Department. A result is expected in the middle of this month (March).

In the meantime, two further fund-raising Open Days are to be held this year at the coach-house on **Saturday, the 20th June** and **Saturday, the 5th September**. New Bonus Ball competitions will be instigated on both these occasions but an additional Bonus Ball competition is to be set up separately to run for five consecutive Saturdays starting on the 4th April. If you are interested in taking part, you are reminded that the cost is £5 per entry and that you choose any number between 1 and 49 that has not already been taken by someone else. If your number is the same as the National Lottery Bonus Ball on any of the five Saturday evening Draws during the course of the completion, you will win £25. Ask David or Cathy Galloway if you wish to enter.

These Open Days and their associated Bonus Ball competitions have been invaluable fund-raisers for the past three years and have helped the Committee to afford to pay an architect to draw up the necessary plans and other experts to undertake a structural survey and provide a Design and Access statement, a Heritage statement and a flood risk assessment. We hope that the Coach-house should be up and running by 2016.
