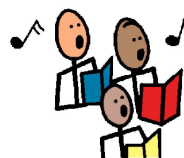
Airmyn W I is looking for new members, is this something for you?

Airmyn Parish Emergency Planning Team

At the last meeting of the Emergency Planning Team, two of the Environment Agency Flood Resilience Officers attended to explain the role of Flood Wardens. After the meeting, four volunteers have come forward to act as Environment Agency Flood Wardens: they will act as the Environment Agency's eyes and ears on the ground and will send, as required, accurate and up to date information relating to the state of the River Aire.

The tidal surge on Boxing Day 2015 has meant that there has been much emphasis on the subject of flooding over the past year. This is only one aspect of the role of the Emergency Planning Team. The Team exists to give support to the community and local knowledge to the Emergency Services in any major emergency; this could be an airplane crash or major fuel or chemical spill.

Extract Minutes of the Airmyn Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 8 February 2017 at 7.00pm

Councillors present were J Peake(Chair), Cllr S Hayward, Cllr C Fox and Cllr P Gardner. Three members of the public
167/1617 Mobile phones The chair reminded everyone that these should be switched to silent mode.

168/1617 Co-option of new councillors. None

169/1617 Apologies for absence. None

170/1617 Confirmation of minutes. The minutes of the parish council meeting held on 11 January 2017 were signed as a true and complete record.

171/1617 Declarations of interest. None declared.

172/1617 Information on ongoing issues.

172.1 Bracken Hill. The grant application will be completed and sent to TRCF. Advice sought from L Whitehead, East Riding of Yorkshire Council and ERNLLCA re access arrangements. Insurance re public liability on the site to be checked by the Clerk. Signage will be erected suitable for a wooded area. No fires, no camping, no shooting. Resolved to request a kissing gate in the grant application which will allow public access. Cllr Fox to be the referee for the grant.

172.2 Elite factory will increase traffic through the village. Traffic calming measures are needed. No representative attending this meeting from ERYC and investigations into the traffic problems will take 3 months. Clerk to request their ideas re road markings necessary in the village.

172.3 Updates from the Environment Agency regarding the Riverbank. Resolved when East Riding of Yorkshire Council forward the highway specifications these should be sent to the Environment agency. Clerk will forward the email to the Emergency committee.

172.4 Litter at roundabout. The clerk had found an agreement from MacDonald's to collect litter within a mile radius of their site. Resolved the Clerk to contact East Riding of Yorkshire Council to clear all the litter from the roundabouts and adjoining roads.

172.5 Airmyn Neighbourhood Watch CCTV updates. Resolved to take this item off the agenda. The cost of camera installations will be too prohibitive. Neighbourhood watch to be advised.

172.6 Wheelie Bin speed stickers. Resolved the Clerk will order some stickers, Cllr Gardner volunteered to distribute

173/1617 Planning Applications

17/00211/PAD Display of 4 non-illuminated, pole mounted signs Rawcliffe Road West Roundabout -East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

17/00212/PAD Display of 3 non-illuminated, pole-mounted signs. Rawcliffe road East Roundabout East Riding of Yorkshire Council. Resolved to have No objections to these plans. The Clerk to record our observations that the litter will need to be cleared from the roundabouts and adjacent roads to attract sponsors.

175.1 A request has been made by a village resident to Clay pigeon shoot on Bracken Hill. Also the issue of overwintering birds will be overseen. No permission can be granted for shooting at Bracken Hill due to its roadside location. The footpath is used and it is hoped that the public will visit when access to the site may be possible should its grant application be successful.

175.2 Picket fence-funding initiatives. A resident has kindly volunteered to erect a post and rail fence on the approach to the Memorial Hall. The precept has not been increased this year and no additional expenditure is being considered at this time. Resolved the Clerk write and thank the resident for his time and volunteering.

175.3 Clock tower gardens. Following a complaint by a resident East Riding of Yorkshire Council have acted to have cable drums removed from this site.

177/1617 Ward Councillor's Reports Landscaping at Elite and at Court House Farm needs to be checked by East Riding planning department. A plant screen was to be put in as a condition of planning being granted. Resolved the Clerk will follow up.
