The three current parish councillors welcomed 20 village residents to the annual parish meeting held on 3 May 2017 at 7pm.

Reports were presented by Sue Hayward for the Parish Council and Airmyn Community Association, Helen Cowling for the Newsletter, Cathie Galloway for the Coach House committee, Airmyn Parochial Church Council and the Airmyn W.I and Mary Mason Pitt for the Airmyn Emergency Planning Team. Written reports were read from Mr Chris Morris the Secretary of the Airmyn Bowls Association and Airmyn Neighbourhood Watch group.

These reports will be available on the website shortly.

Following the recent letter to every household a discussion took place on how the parish council needs more councillors to deal with village matters and prevent decisions being taken from people living outside the village. Four volunteers came forward with expressions of interest from 3 others.

#### Minutes of the Airmyn Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 12 April 2017 at 7.00pm,

Councillors present were S Hayward(Chair), C Fox and P Gardner. 4 members of the public and the PCSO S Chandler. 1/1718 Mobile phones The chair reminded everyone that these should be switched to silent mode.

2/1718 Co-option of new councillors. None

3/1718 Apologies for absence. None

11/1718 Ward Councillor report. The Chair gave permission for this item to be brought forward at this meeting. The trees near the village hall have had work carried out on them following misunderstandings and, after intervention by Councillor Fox in her role as Ward Councillor, the area will be cleared and tidied without any expense to the parish council. Currently there are only three parish councillors and it is getting impossible to deal with all the Memorial Hall matters, trees and playing field areas which were previously overseen by up to nine Parish Councillors and separate committees. To make the parish council quorate all three councillors must be present at every meeting and the full council should consist of 9 councillors to ensure that full debate and decision making take place for the good of the village. In May 2015, at the last election, the East Riding of Yorkshire Council had to appoint two ward councillors to make Airmyn Parish Council quorate and this will happen again if any of the current parish councillors resign. The annual general meeting of the parish council is on the 3 May 2017. It is hoped new volunteers will come forward to make decisions on how the precept is spent and to avoid people not resident in Airmyn making decisions for the village. This year there is no increase in the precept. When volunteers looked after the playing fields and Memorial hall both were well run with very good finances in place to back up expenditure. Residents are also needed to sit on the Goole and Airmyn Drainage Board as this is also an example of people spending our money without any representation from the village. A letter will be drafted and delivered to every house to explain how new parish councillors are vital for the good of the village.

4/1718 Confirmation of minutes. The minutes of the parish council meeting held on 8 March 2017 were signed as a true and complete record.

5/1718 Declarations of interest. None declared.

6/1718 Information on ongoing issues

- 6.1 Bracken Hill. The PCSO will contact the wildlife officer Julie Turrell and determine how to police this area. Cllr Fox will check with ERYC as to what signage we can erect. The police do keep an ongoing diary and all residents should report anything suspicious arising in this area by ringing 101. Automatic bird scarers are often mistaken for shooting. The grant application will be processed by Two Ridings.
- 6.2 Traffic plans from ERYC. Update from ERYC has been received re the speed reduction near the recycling centre. Work has commenced on this and further reports will be forthcoming but it is feared that the cost to the village may be too high.
- 6.3 Updates Environment Agency work on the riverbank. Email from resident, with photographs of the work carried out in the riverbed. Road design details required from ERYC to forward to the environment agency.
- 6.4 Speed stickers ERYC permission. ERYC will not allow speed stickers fearing they are a distraction to motorists. No purchase can be made.
- 6.5 Trees adjacent the dog walk. See 11 above.
- 6.6 Litter at motorway roundabout. ERYC are dealing with this and the roundabouts should be cleared.
- 7/1718 Planning Granted 17/00211/PAD Display of 4 non-illuminated, pole mounted signs. Rawcliffe Road West Roundabout Airmyn.
- 17/00212. Display of 3 non-illuminated, pole mounted signs. Rawcliffe Road East Roundabout Goole.
- 17/00791. McDonalds Rawcliffe Road, Airmyn. Erection of single storey extensions and associated alterations to existing McDonald's, installation of replacement drive thru booths, a Goal Post height restrictor and a wall mounted sign. No objections or comments to these plans.


