GRANTS GIVE PROJECTS THE GREEN LIGHT

The Airmyn News is pleased to report that two grants from the Two Rivers Community Fund, which most readers will probably know as the Rushholme Windfarm grant-making charity, have just been awarded to village projects.

The first grant of some £6,000 has been given to Airmyn Community Association, to fund the renovation of the kitchen areas and repainting of the Hall's interior. It had been hoped that the full £13,000 requested would be forthcoming, however, there may be scope to attract "matched funding" from a different charitable source. The





ACA are also actively working on plans to make additional improvements and cost-saving alterations to the Hall. Please see overleaf to learn how you can get involved and influence the future direction of the Hall's development.

The second, of around £10,000, is to be used for an environmental project to preserve and enhance Bracken Hill, in conjunction with the Trust for Conservation Volunteers. TCV are a national charity with headquarters at Lakeside in Doncaster. TCV has been around for over 50 years, and works across the UK to create healthier and happier communities by improving well-being, conserving well-loved outdoor spaces or bringing people together to promote social cohesion, combat loneliness and enhance employment prospects.

They work with local volunteers on varied conservation projects and train people in practical and transferable skills to help them improve their prospects or indeed gain paid employment. Their remit is also educational, teaching the public about conservation and the importance of the outdoors. You can find out more at www.tcv.org.uk.

Further details of the Bracken Hill project will be publicized in due course, and it is hoped that the parishioners of Airmyn will take advantage of this opportunity to do something really worthwhile for the Parish's well-being.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE AIRMYN PARISH COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY 10 FEBRUARY

Councillors present: Cllr Peake (Chair), Cllr S Hayward, Cllr P Gardner, Cllr A Thompson, Cllr C Fox and Cllr R Shelton.

Mrs H Cowling, Chair of the ACA reported that the Committee are to engage the services of Groundworks to assist with grant applications and project management of improvements to facilities: since the Hall opened in 1993 there have been no updates or sizeable repairs. It was stressed that the goal is to make sure the Hall stays open for community use.

<u>Planning</u>

- Letter from ERYC Section 116 of the Highways Act 1980. Stopping up of part of the highway at Airmyn Filling Station Glews Garage Rawcliffe Road Airmyn. No objections.
- Planning update land East of 15 The Crossings: the container is now painted green in accordance with ERYC requirements.

Issues raised by councillors:

- Resolved that the sandbag grant provided by the ERYC will be given in full to the emergency committee to purchase sand storage containers, sand and bags
- The grant application submitted by Ian Jakulis of TCV for the project at Bracken Hill has been refused. Clerk to obtain his proposals and grant for re-submission by the Parish Council.
- Cllr Hayward has checked, loosened and cleaned rubbish from the grit bins. The White City, Bridge Close and Ferry Lane bins need refills. A dog waste bin is needed at Ferry Lane. Clerk to write to ERYC and obtain a quote and also confirm if ERYC will then take on responsibility for emptying the dog bin. Thanks were given to Mr Gunson for his assistance to the Parish Council.
- Minutes from the Police Commissioner's public meeting on 3 February 2016 were provided by Cllr Hayward. Resolved to consult the village re the installation of CCTV by means of a questionnaire. A potential grant of £2500 from the Police and Crime Commissioner, with fundraising would be used, but the costs may need to be underwritten by the Parish Council.
- Ownership of land adjacent to Airmyn Garage and at the top of the Paddock: The clerk advised the relevant date is 5 June 2017.No claim at Land registry.
- Council meeting format: ways to improve the effectiveness, efficiency and convenience to public attendees were discussed. These included means of shortening the agenda, allowing specific matters to be dealt with more thoroughly and quickly, and letting the public speak at the beginning of the meeting so that they did not have to endure the often lengthy proceedings. Resolved to ascertain via ERNLLCA instances when public and press should be excluded from sections of the meetings. Clerk to report at the March meeting. Resolved to move finance to the end of the meeting and public participation to the beginning of the meeting.
- Standing orders: Cllr Thompson is still carrying out a review and this will be revisited next month.
- Resolved that the ACA PayPal account be added to the financial regulations as per ERNLLCA guidance.
- Resolved that the Chair will appoint a Personnel Committee to deal with staffing matters if required.
- Resolved that the Council will adopt the new national rules on smaller authorities audit appointments for the next 5 years.
- Noted: 31 March is the deadline for new applications to Goole Fields Wind Farm Community Grants.
- By public request, letter of thanks to be sent to Community Payback for work done at the Crossings.
- Clerk to advise ERYC that Bridleways signposts are still down and need to be erected.
