# **TOUR DE YORKSHIRE UP-DATE**

Don't forget that the Tour de Yorkshire cycle race will be coming through Airmyn and past White City, travelling on to Rawcliffe as it makes its way to Doncaster on **THURSDAY 3RD MAY.** 

You can keep up with the latest information by looking at the Tour de Yorkshire website (www.tour-de-yorkshire.co.uk).

Timings given for the day are only approximate as we do not know how fast the cyclists will be travelling, but currently they are given as follows:

- Ladies race due to arrive in Airmyn at approximately 10:51am to 11:05am
- Advertisers' caravan at approximately 2:52pm to 2:55pm
- Men's race at approximately 4:58pm to 5:15pm

Refreshments will be available at the Church Lychgate during the day. There will obviously be some road closures during the times of the races but we have not been informed of these as yet. Do keep a look out for notices about this, especially if you live on the High Street and leave your vehicle on the roadside.

#### Friends of Bracken Hill...

On Thursday 5th April a group of villagers, Parish Councillors and a representative from The Smile Foundation met with Chris Tomson, RSPB conservation officer for the North of England, to take a look at the potential for the site as a long term project for bird and wildlife. The walk around proved to be very successful, there are a number of well established trees and areas that lend themselves to be cleared to let light in through coppicing. There are areas of bramble to provide nesting cover, which should be encouraged, along with teasels to provide food. Chris described the wood as a cold one as it stands, but there are ways we can open it up to create a warmer environment to encourage more activity, along with siting bird boxes. On the walk, we heard at least five different species of bird already visiting, there was a lovely show of violets with fungi and moss growing underfoot. The Volunteer Conservation Trust had made a good start on a path, which can be expanded, along with standing log piles to encourage insects. At the time of our walk the heavy rain had created wet areas and Chris felt that it was a nice feature to encourage to stay. From a health and safety point of view, Chris pointed out the obvious trip hazards and potential falling wood, although this would not be a big issue in a young wood like Bracken Hill. The fact that the wood stands on an old refuse site was raised but he thought that in his opinion, as long as the refuse stays covered up, then it should be fine. The fact that trees, bushes, flowers, birds and other animals are thriving there would suggest that there are no issues with hazardous gasses escaping. Volunteers within the Bracken Hill Friends group have offered to undertake regular health and safety checks. At the end of our walk, Chris expressed his feelings that there is a good potential for the wood to be managed successfully and has posted some woodland management brochures to the group.

#### Services at St. David's in May

Sunday, 6<sup>th</sup> May Holy Communion 6-00 pm

Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> May Ascension Day Service in Rawcliffe church at 7-30 pm

Everyone is reminded, once again, that you do not have to be confirmed in order to attend a service of Holy Communion. These services always include prayers and hymns that you will be reasonably familiar with as well as the sermon (or talk, if you like,) given by whoever is leading the service. The hymns and prayers are often related to the time of year or to international, national or local events or to personal needs.

#### **Ten Days of Prayer**

From Ascension Day on the 10<sup>th</sup> May until Whit Sunday (or Pentecost) on the 20<sup>th</sup> May, St. David's church will be open from 9-00 am until 5-00 pm so that any individuals or groups may go in to sit down for a while in its peaceful atmosphere and take time out for private prayer or reflection.

#### **Free Compost**

It is the time of year when one or other of the two compost heaps in the church-yard is made to yield its harvest of dark, rich, well-rotted compost (two years old) for the benefit of local gardeners. This time it is the heap to the rear of the church which has been opened up to reveal the very best of the compost. The deeper you dig, the better it gets. It is especially good as either a mulch around shrubs or fruit bushes or for improving heavy soil and making it more workable. Bring a barrow and a spade and take as much as you like.

#### Volunteers possibly needed to assist with painting the church interior

There is a distinct possibility that the inside walls and ceilings of St. David's church will be painted during this year. This job has always been done by volunteers under the direction of the wardens in the past and the same plan is what we have in mind this time. The last time that this job was done was way back in the year 2000, however, so it seems likely that some new members will be required for the decorating team this time. Please contact the churchwardens, David Galloway and Janet Rushby, if you would be interested in helping out on this occasion when the time comes.
