The 'Grin & Tonic' sessions were set up as part of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Sport, Play & Arts Services 'let's get moving' programme which is a 'mobile health programme' funded by adult services at the council and the focus is to provide activities in a variety of settings for adults 50+ and adults with a disability. A 'taster' session of activities was set up in Airmyn at the Village Hall which proved successful with 16 people attending. As a result of this 6 further free activity sessions were offered and numbers attending continued to increase and after 6 weeks an evaluation was carried out with participants of the session and from the results received it proved the need for the group to continue in the village and become sustained by achieving funding to do this. The sessions continued to run with a charge of £1.50 and in December a 'Connecting Communities' grant application was submitted for equipment to sustain the sessions and just before Christmas the news was received that the application was successful!

'Invest in Ali' Fundraising

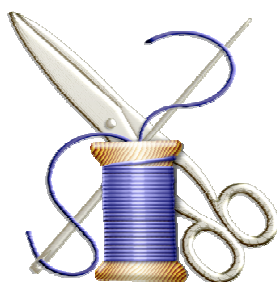
£550 was raised by neighbours for the 'Invest in Ali' fund to help bring Alison Coulthard back home from hospital in time for Christmas.

Councillors Present were Cllr J Peake(Chair), Cllr S Hayward, Cllr C Fox and Cllr P Gardner. 2 members of the public attended.

120/1617 Mobile Phones. The chair reminded everyone that these should be switched to silent mode.

121/1617 Co-option of new councillors. None

122/1617 Apologies for absence. None.

123/1617 Confirmation of minutes. The minutes of the 12 October meeting were signed as a true and complete record.

124/1617 Declarations of Interest. None Declared.

125/1617 ACA Matters. The Chair moved that staffing issues are to be moved to the end of the meeting to exclude the press and public. ACA meeting to follow at 8pm. Resolved to remove the ACA standing item from this agenda.

126/1617 Information on the following ongoing issues.

126.1 Asset Register. Cllr P Gardner and Cllr S Hayward are to ensure that this is completed by 31 March 2017.

126.2 Grass tenders. Four tenders received but two separate contracts can be bid for. The Clerk will scan and email details of all the tenders to all the parish councillors. The December agenda item will hopefully award the contracts. Resolved the next parish council meeting will be held on 2pm Wednesday 21st December

126.3 Precept. The Clerk will check when the band D rate for the Parish is due for issue by East Riding of Yorkshire Council. Initial precept workings will be available for the next meeting prepared by the Clerk and for consideration by everyone.

126.4 East Riding Council have issued a letter itemising the use of public payphones throughout the East Riding. Three options detailed and choice to be made. Resolved the Airmyn phone box can be removed due to the poor usage statistics provided.

128.1 Filled sandbags. Letter received from the Emergency Committee detailing the number and price of sandbags required. Resolved the parish council will apply for the available grant to East Riding. The shortfall can possibly be paid by the emergency committee but the parish council agree to underwrite the shortfall of £112.27 if no other monies available.

129 Issues arising from new correspondence

ERA of RCB membership will be carried forward to the next agenda. £25 is the membership amount.

130 Upcoming meetings. None.

131 Ward Councillors reports. The riverbank will have work carried out by the environment agency in late November. The office of Andrew Percy MP has released an update on how the defences at Airmyn are to be dealt with, using rock bag placements. The environment agency met recently with the emergency committee and the parish council need updates for the next meeting.

132 Safety Concerns A hit and run, during the night, occurred recently in the High Street. This will be reported to East Riding Council with the appropriate photographs. North Yorkshire County Council have adopted a new speed watch programme. It operates in conjunction with North Yorkshire Police and local communities which suffer from speeding vehicles. Resolved Cllr Fox take forward to East Riding Council to see if the village could have a similar scheme, which apparently is having success in monitoring and reducing speeding traffic. The new newsletter editor Mrs R Lowe will maybe highlight the speed issues in the village in the newsletter.

Minutes of the Airmyn Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 21 December 2016 at 2.00pm.

Councillors present were Cllr J Peake(Chair), Cllr S Hayward, Cllr C Fox and Cllr P Gardner.

The Chair of the Emergency committee reported to the parish council that 300 sandbags had been distributed using the survey conducted by them earlier in the year. Donations had been received and these will be retained by the Emergency committee as the grant from ERYC should cover the costs of the sandbags.

No members of the public attended the meeting.

136/1617 Mobile phones. The chair reminded everyone that these should be switched to silent mode.

137/1617 Co-option of new councillors. None

138/1617 Apologies for absence. None

139/1617 Confirmation of minutes. The minutes of the 9 November meeting were signed as a true and complete record.

140/1617 Declarations of interest. None declared.

141/1617 Information on ongoing issues.

141.1 Cllr Fox will contact Safer and Stronger communities and report back at the next meeting also Contact the Police and crime commissioner for the possible adoption of North Yorkshire Councils speed awareness measures. A resident's letter sent to ERYC will be checked for responses. Resolved to request a mobile speed van for the village.

141.2 Grass Tenders. The tenders had been circulated to the parish councillors prior to the meeting. A comparison sheet had been prepared for ease of decision. The Clerk reported that both the existing contractors had served the village well for the last three years. No complaints had been received regarding their work. Resolved to continue with the existing contractor's R Westmoreland for the riverbank and G Fillingham for the Trees, Playground and playing field. The Clerk will send letters to the other contractors thanking them for quotes.

141.3 Riverbank update. The environment agency has started work on the riverbank and in the river today.

141.4 Grant for sandbags This is still outstanding but promised by ERYC before the month end. Resolved to determine the shortfall in the sandbag purchase.

141.5 CCTV updates. Cllr Fox has established there is a Camera at the recycling centre and perhaps this could be utilised when considering expenditure in the village on CCTV. The Neighbourhood watch group must apply for grants and Cllr Fox will liaise with this committee.

141.6 The precept has to be set at the January meeting. The draft workings have been prepared with no increased expenditure foreseen for the coming year. Nationally it has been agreed that the government will not prevent parish councils from increasing precepts this year.

The resident had also offered to install a small picket fence around the roundabout approaching the hall. The council agreed that this would visually enhance the approach to the hall and the Clerk was therefore asked to investigate the cost of materials, including an access gate (for maintenance)

144.2 No offers of a mower from the cricket club have been received.

144.3 Chairman's Award. A village resident is to be nominated. The clerk will contact residents for information to complete the nomination.

144.4 Equality Policy. Resolved to adopt the equality policy as issued by ERYC for grant purposes. Chair signed this.

146/1617 Ward Councillors reports. Cllr Fox reported on the very trying year for the parish councillors who have had to volunteer their time to run the Memorial Hall in the absence of any committee. Cllr Fox especially thanked the vice chair S Hayward for the time and energy she had given organising volunteers, helping start the new Grin and Tonic session and supervising the new kitchen installation.
