The Tour de Yorkshire is coming to Airmyn...

The Parish Council held a public meeting on Tuesday 16 January to discuss our involvement in the Tour de Yorkshire when it comes from Beverley, through Airmyn, past White City and on to Rawcliffe on its way to Doncaster on the first day, Thursday 3 May 2018. The meeting was very well attended by more than 20 residents on what was a very cold evening.

Some residents had already been in contact offering help to prepare for the event by making bunting, the recycling centre in the village had agreed to provide any cycles or wheels that were brought in so that they could be painted for decoration around the village, the church had agreed to run a refreshment stall at the lychgate and the school had expressed an interest in being involved too.

Discussion took place about car parking and some businesses were to be approached to see if they would help provide parking on the day. Cars normally parked on the roadside along High Street will be asked to park elsewhere on the day, as the road must be clear and will be closed for some of the time. More details will become clear as information comes through from ERYC and the race organisers.

We discussed bunting, balloons and ribbons in blue and yellow to decorate houses along the route from Boothferry Bridge to the roundabout and out to White City. It was suggested that those with hanging baskets or with space to put pots out could plant them in a blue and yellow colour scheme. Residents present offered help to paint the cycles or wheels given by the recycling centre. Sam Stevens offered to make ribbon decorations for the Airmyn village signs and the school was keen to be involved in making decorations of some sort. Land Art was also mentioned, an interesting idea where a picture is constructed on an open area of land so that it can be viewed from above by the TV helicopter. If anyone would like to take this idea further then do please come forward.

We then discussed the safest places for the school children to be sited so that they get a good view but are kept safe. Several locations were mentioned and this needs to be investigated further. It was pointed out by a resident that there will not be any barriers to keep by-standers out of the road and so safety would be paramount.

We have already had contact regarding the information booklet which is passed to the TV Commentators. David Galloway, our village historian, has put together some interesting facts about the village and these have been forwarded to ERYC. More information will be sent to us by the organisers as the weeks go on, and this will be communicated to residents via websites and The Airmyn News.

Names, contact details and offers of help were taken down at the meeting, but if you would like to offer your services or have a particular skill that would be useful then do please come forward and help to make the day memorable for our Parish. Extract Minutes of the Airmyn Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 13 December 2017 at 7.00pm.

Councillors present were S Hayward(Chair), C Fox, S Scott, C Healey. Members of the public 2. The Clerk was in attendance. 133/1718 Co-option of new councillors. Mr P Batten, Mr M Lynch and Ms T Storr were co-opted onto the parish council. The declarations of office were signed, and the Localism Act 2011 declaration made.

134/1718 Apologies for absence. None.

135/1718 Confirmation of minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on 8 November 2017 were agreed as a true record. 136/1718 Declarations of interest. C Fox declared her membership of the Western Area Planning Committee.

137/1718 Ongoing issues.

137.1 Bracken Hill. No updates had been received from ERYC. The Clerk was requested to write to Mr Read at ERYC and provide any further information which is needed.

137.2 Land Claim for Possessory Title. Two firms have been contacted and legal fees are in the region of £750 plus vat. These are the approximate costs if no issues arise to complicate the title claim. The clerk will enquire as to the position if the parish council takes no further action at this time. Resolved letter of thanks to Mr P Gardner be sent regarding the gardening he undertakes on one of the pieces of land.

137.3 Quotes for Playground Work. Cllr Lynch requested that the play area report be forwarded to him. Resolved another quote is needed to consider all options for improving the playground. The report itemised 5 pieces of equipment as "Moderate Risk" and these would need attention first.

137.4 Resolved the Clerk to purchase a St Georges Flag to complete the set of flags currently required. Thanks, were expressed to the resident who had repaired the rope free of charge and reattached the flag.

138/1718 Planning Granted

PA/03374 Erection of single storey extension to create Managers Office McDonalds Restaurants Goole.

DC/17/0374 Trees Airmyn No 1 for Mrs Webster. Consent granted.

New Planning applications.

17/04043 Erection of single storey extensions to existing McDonalds restaurant. Resolved no objections or comments.

17/03906/PLF Mr S Wood. Erection of detached garden room 77 High Street Airmyn Goole. Resolved no objections or comments. 139/1718 Issues raised by councillors. Dog Exclusion notices. A visit was made on Thursday 16 November 2017 to the play area. The signage was amended by the ERYC officer who had the appropriate updates with him. The newsletter has also carried an article on dog fouling. Residents can report people if they have a name and address of the person whose dog is fouling. 140/1718 Issues arising from new correspondence.

140.1 Trees Elite. A resident complained that the screening has not taken place as in the approved plans. A planning Officer from ERYC has visited the site to ensure all the planning conditions are adhered to.

140.2 ERYC Chairman's Award 2018. Five categories. Resolved not to make any nominations this year, due to lack of preparation time before the deadline, but to ask residents in the newsletter if anyone can be recommended for an award next year. This will give time to prepare letters and photographs for a file to be sent to ERYC with lots of varied contributions in support of an application. 140.3 Precept 2018/2019. Following a discussion, the councillors agreed that costings have to be included in the precept for the costs associated with a possible land title claim, Playground repairs, a new computer for the Clerk, possible Tour de Yorkshire costs and filling the village grit bins now a cold weather grant cannot be claimed from ERYC.

140.4 External auditor appointment 2018-2019 PKF Littlejohn LLP.

140.5 ERYC requesting feedback on Taskforce Survey in July 2017. The Chair, Cllr Scott and the Clerk will complete and return. 140.6 Tour de Yorkshire visiting Airmyn village on the 3 May 2018. The riverbank will be an excellent vantage point and the village will be seen by many TV viewers and it will attract visitors. Resolved that a flyer will be prepared and delivered to every household and a public meeting will be held on Tuesday 16 January 2018 at 7.30 to welcome views and ideas for the visit of the Tour. 141/1718 Upcoming meetings. None Listed.

142/1718 Ward Councillor's Reports. A press release has been issued to remind everyone to care for lonely neighbours and any Vulnerable residents they may know. Plans are proceeding for a defibrillator at the Memorial Hall.

143/1718 Safety Concerns The play area grass is very long. Resolved to ask for another cut when the weather is suitable. Weed spraying will also be requested before next April. The salt bins owned by the parish council are to be checked for adequate levels. 144/1718 Financial matters The bank reconciliation and respective bank statements up to 30 November 2017 had previously been circulated and were agreed as a true record and signed accordingly.
