Remembrance Sunday

As we are sure everyone reading this newsletter will already know, Sunday, the 11th November this year will be the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. We are marking the occasion at St. David's with a small exhibition inside the church which should be of some interest to people of all ages. The church will therefore be open on both Saturday, the 10th and Sunday the 11th from 10-00 am onwards for visitors to have a look at what is on display and also, if they wish, to sit down in church for a while just to reflect on how different everyday life must have become for Airmyn

villagers during those years from 1914 to 1918, whether they were involved in the fighting overseas or whether they were trying to carry on as normal at

home whilst waiting anxiously for news from loved ones who were away.

Our Vicar, the Rev. Philip Ball, will lead a service of remembrance in the church at 6-00 pm on Sunday, the 11th, to which everyone is welcome. There will also be a chance to observe the customary two minutes of silence in church at precisely 11-00 on the Sunday morning. This 'silence' will be preceded by the sounding of 'The Last Post' and followed by 'The Reveille'. Again, anyone who wishes to be in church at that time and for that purpose will be most welcome.
